Dear Parents and carers

It is with a sigh of relief that the mass testing of students in school has now been completed. Over the last 9 days we have completed around 2700 tests and this huge logistical operation has gone incredibly smoothly. I must publicly thank Mr Ahmed and Mrs Gibbs for all their efforts in coordinating the testing along with all the staff from school and our volunteers for all their efforts with the testing. The students have responded incredibly well and have approached the testing process with a real sense of maturity, knowing that these will probably be the only tests they do in school where they want a negative outcome! You will be aware, that out of all the tests we have completed, we have had only one positive result and as we move to home testing, I will of course keep you informed should there be any further positive cases. As I said last week, depending on the time I receive notification of a positive case it may be necessary to ask a full year group to stay home the next day whilst we trace close contacts so please keep your eyes open for late night texts and emails.

All students have now been sent home with testing kits. The instructions are relatively straight forward, and I strongly encourage you to keep up with the home testing regime on a Sunday and Wednesday evening. As you will be aware the mass testing programme is designed to limit the spread of coronavirus and keep everyone in our community safe. We will continue to send kits home with students and please continue to test throughout the Easter holidays. There is no need to inform the school of a negative test result - we do not have the capacity to log 900+ call or emails every 3 days but of course you must let us know of any positive results. If your child does test positive at home, all members within the household will need to isolate but you must then organise a PCR lab test. For home testing, a PCR result does overrule a lateral flow test, so if the PCR test result is negative everyone can immediately stop isolating.

I have been really impressed how, with no fuss, our students have complied with the wearing of masks in lessons. We do not know yet if this will continue after Easter. Earlier this week we received over 40,000 face masks from the Department of Education, so if any parent or carer would like a free supply of masks for your child please let us know.

Just as the students all returned to school, we also received a small supply of laptops from the Department of Education to help students with remote learning! Obviously, these will come in useful should we need to send any students home to isolate but I am also aware that some students do not have laptop or tablet access. If you feel your child would benefit from borrowing a laptop for studying at home, please let Mrs Elsworth know. Please bear in mind we only have a limited supply.

I hope by now you will all have had a chance to read the Ofsted report I emailed out yesterday. Just to say how incredibly proud I am of all in our school community, thank you for all your support, stay safe and do not hesitate to get in touch if you have any concerns.


