Dear Parent/Carers

Lady Lumley's staff and students are enjoying exploring the opportunity to get involved in a wide range of different activities. The offer includes cheerleading, football, golf, Duke of Edinburgh, Japanese and so much more! We will keep you posted on how our students are learning differently. Many students are going 'above and beyond' - both in the classroom and around school, and their efforts are being recognised by staff on classcharts and in assembly. As the term goes on, we will take feedback from students on what they are benefitting from and what else, within reason, they would appreciate.

My apologies to parents who were trying without success to contact school last Friday, we lost all connectivity through phone or internet. Equally to those parents who had left messages on the answer phone, we lost the ability to play those messages and had to phone to seek confirmation of absence. This was a problem outside of the control of the school or the Trust and we hope it has now been resolved. Please do ensure that you notify of absence every day to enable the school to have an accurate record of attendance and of course, most importantly to keep children safe.

The school continues to follow Public Health England's guidance on managing Covid-19 and remind students to continue to take LFT and wash their hands regularly. If students are symptomatic then they should book a PCR test and self-isolate whilst they await the results. If a student is concerned that they have been a 'close contact' but don't have symptoms then again, they should book a PCR test but are not required to self-isolate.

On Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> October, Lady Lumley's will have the first 'Parent Collaboration Evening' 6pm-7pm. We are keen to provide parents with the opportunity to come into school, learn a little more of what we are doing and why. At the first meeting, Mr Davis will lead a 30-minute session on the changes we have made to feedback and how parents can support with this. The second 30 minutes will be an opportunity for parents to let us know what other sessions they would be interested in – we are planning now around wellbeing, revision techniques and supporting SEND students. This hour's session is for all parents, of all year groups, and there will be more details to follow.

### **Salbutamol Emergency Inhalers**

If your child is asthmatic Lady Lumley's School now holds salbutamol emergency inhalers (commonly known as the blue inhaler) on the school premises, and portable kits for use on trips off site.

These inhalers are designed for emergency use and should not replace good practice in your child carrying their own inhaler or having their own named inhaler held at reception. However, in the event of an emergency where an inhaler has been forgotten or run out, the school inhalers can be used.

If you do not wish to consent, please make sure that your child has a working, in-date inhaler, clearly labelled with their name, which they will bring with them to school every day and it will also be your responsibility to provide the school with a spare inhaler prescribed for your child. Thank you.

### **Information re immunisation catch up clinics for Ryedale**

For all children that have outstanding vaccinations the immunisation team will be running clinics in Scarborough, Whitby, and Ryedale. All appointment for vaccinations needs to be pre booked via the booking admin team. The number to contact to book onto these sessions is:

The admin team will then be able to give out the dates with availability for parents to book their child into one of the sessions with an allocated time slot. These sessions aren't drop in sessions and all children need to be booked in prior to attending.

### COVID-19 Testing

We ask that students take a covid-19 lateral flow test on a Sunday evening and Wednesday evening.
