Geography Fieldtrips Year 12 and Year 10

It has been a busy couple of weeks for fieldtrips in the geography department!

On Wednesday 16th March our Year 12 geographers enjoyed a rather damp visit to Robin Hood's Bay. Mrs Fuller imparted her in depth knowledge of coastal features and management used at this picturesque location on the edge of the North York Moors National Park, whilst the students dutifully wrote notes in their soggy booklets. They even managed to find an open fish and chip shop (plus ice cream?!) for their lunch. One student was heard to comment on how

lucky we are to live so close to such breath-taking scenery. This week was the turn of our Year 10 geographers, who took a trip to Malton to investigate variations in quality of life across the "food capital of Yorkshire". The students were also brave enough to conduct several surveys with the public to find out their views. MFL Trip to University of York Department of Language and Linguistic Science

Over the last two weeks, groups of our Year 9 and Year 10 students have had the chance to discover more about language learning beyond GCSE and A-level at University of York.

Students took part in French and German taster sessions focusing on the French-speaking world and for Y9, a focus on German films. There was an opportunity to listen to some university language students talking about their language journeys since school, their year abroad and their plans for the future. The diversity a languages degree has to offer is exciting; you not only learn about the language but also about the culture, politics, history, geography, society, literature and film of the country whose language you are studying. All of these different elements give us such an important insight into the wider world. It is also possible to learn a new language as a beginner and combine this with any degree choice, opening up brilliant opportunities for travel and career prospects.



After lunch and a campus tour, students also took part in some interactive activities led by the linguistics department, with a focus on analysing word order in a range of languages and also etymology – the history of words. This is something we hope will become more and more familiar to students as we continue to explore vocabulary across our curriculum so that our students are confident in using academic language in all their subjects.

Well done to all the students who took part, the university lecturers and students were so impressed with your engagement and enthusiasm – you were a credit to the school.

The Brilliant Club – Scholars' Programme

This week saw the launch of Lady Lumley's first Scholars' Programme, which is designed to support students to develop skills and knowledge to make ambitious and successful applications to universities.

Students enrolled on The Scholars Programme work with a PhD researcher on a university-style module, based on the researcher's world-leading expertise. The programmes are pitched at a Key Stage above where students are currently studying and are designed to develop students' written and verbal communication, critical thinking and metacognition.



Twelve of our Year 10 students will be studying with **Dr Timothy Riding**, a researcher from The Universities of York and Edinburgh, on an Arts and Humanities programme entitled: *'The Key of the Universe': Panama, Scotland and Global History, 1695–1700'*. 
