
### **Reading at Lady Lumley's**

#### **Tutor Read**

This year we are starting a Tutor Read programme for all students in Years 7-10. Each year group has been allocated a different book, which will be kept in their tutor room. The students' tutor will read to them twice a week, with students following in their own copies. Over the year we will read two books. The books we have selected will raise interesting discussions as the characters they describe come from a range of backgrounds, cultures and life experiences.

In school and in life, reading is a fundamental part of learning about the world and provides us with an insight into new experiences and ideas. Reading in tutor, and having the space and time as a reading community to discuss some of the issues and experiences we encounter, will enable reading for pleasure and enjoyment as a whole school experience, as well as making real connections to their 'Life' lessons in school. Reading will help build students' 'cultural literacy', and for our students who don't read much outside of school, we hope that this will lead them to find a way of engaging more with reading for pleasure and hopefully find the right book for them.

We hope students enjoy reading these books in tutor time, and that this will lead many of them to look for similar titles or works by the same author either through our school library or online through E-Platform.

#### **Sixth Form News**

Last week five of our ex-students joined the sixth form assembly to present to our current Year 12 & 13 students their experiences of life at Lady Lumley's. They all shared their hints and tips to be as successful as you can be and spoke about their chosen Post 18 pathways including universities and degree apprenticeships.

Mr Carter, Head of Sixth Form also spoke to students about the skills and attributes to be independent learners and how to get the best out of their time in the sixth form both academically and in relation to their personal development.

Students were also introduced to the new enrichment programme for the autumn term which included over 17 different activities to choose from including; football, netball, having your work published on Kindle, politics and debating, Moocs and Ted talks to name a few.

The Year 13 Supporting Success Evening on Wed 14<sup>th</sup> September was well attended where Mr Carter presented how students in Year 13 can prepare for exams, how to make the step up to being Year 13 independent learners, the expanded enrichment on offer in 2022-23 and the new Personal Development element of their curriculum. It was great to know that consideration is given for other options alternative to university as well."




#### **UKMT Maths Challenges**

A new school year brings a fresh round of Maths Challenges, and over the next two weeks our Year 12 and 13 students will have the opportunity to sit two different challenges.

First up is the **Maths Olympiad for Girls**, This Challenge aims to encourage girls to tackle advanced mathematical problems. It is a 2-and-a-half-hour exam aimed at girls and young women across the UK and consists of five challenging problems. Here is an example of a problem from last year's paper

**2.** Consider a  $4 \times 4$  grid numbered 1 to 16 left to right then top to bottom. Tile A or Tile B is placed onto the grid so that it covers three adjacent numbers.



- (a) If Tile A is placed onto the grid (the orientation of the tile may be changed), can the total of the **uncovered** numbers be a multiple of three? (3 marks)
- (b) In how many different ways can Tile B be placed onto the grid (the orientation of the tile may be changed) so that the sum of the **uncovered** numbers is a multiple of three? (7 marks)

The second challenge is the **Senior Maths Challenge** and is open to all students in Years 12 and 13. This is a 90-minute paper consisting of 25 increasingly challenging multiple-choice questions. Students who perform well may have the opportunity to progress onto follow on rounds. Please see below for some example questions from last year.

4. The positive integer k is a solution of the equation (k ÷ 12) ÷ (15 ÷ k) = 20.What is the sum of the digits of k?

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
