On Wednesday 5th October Lady Lumley's held our Year 5 and Year 6 Open Evening. It was fantastic to see the school full to bursting with 175 students and their families. Our class of 2030 was welcomed by Mrs Thompson, Key Stage 3 Leader and Mrs Brown, Pastoral Officer for Year 6 and 7 into a showcase of all our curriculum and enrichment areas. All our staff were there to ensure children and families from Pickering, Thornton Le Dale, Scarborough and all points surrounding had the opportunity to learn about learning from Year 7 to Year 13. Thank you to the 84 Lady Lumley's students who came back to support this evening, with Year 7 tour guides leading the way, to a team of Sports Leaders as well as our sixth formers showing where all the hard work can take you.

We continue to work with our students who travel by bus to Lady Lumley's to improve their conduct and behaviour on the way to and from school, so children are safe. Our Enrichment programme is now under way, giving opportunities for students to try something different as well as get stuck into extra of their favourites. 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Oxbridge Application Workshop

On Tuesday 27th September outreach workers from Cambridge University visited students in Lady Lumley's sixth Form who are aspiring to go to Oxbridge (Oxford and Cambridge University). They gave valuable insight on how to write a personal statement to attract offers and what an interview would be like. I spoke to Tom who coached me in what an interview would be like for my chosen subject- Theology and Religion. He gave me a text to read and annotate for five minutes and then I had to explain to him what the extract meant. I had expected it to be more individual analysis, but he asked questions to steer me in the right direction, exactly as they would do in the interviews.



By removing the myths of what the interview would be like, it made me feel more confident in going into an interview, if I got an offer. Overall, it was a very successful morning that made everyone feel more confident about their application. *Meri Wroe*

United Against Bullying Programme

Lady Lumley's School took part in the Anti-Bullying Alliance "United Against Bullying" Programme. At the beginning of last year some of our students took part in an Anti-Bullying Survey and an Action Plan was drawn up in response to their feedback. The students then repeated the survey at the end of the school year and the impact of the action plan was audited by the Anti-Bullying Alliance. As a result, we are delighted to inform you that we have achieved the Bronze Award. Here is what they said:

"I'm delighted to announce that we're awarding you United Against Bullying BRONZE School status congratulations! This is not an easy award programme and you should be incredibly proud of what you have achieved! For context, we had 217 schools complete the programme with 4% achieving Gold, 32% Silver, 49% Bronze and 15% a certificate of participation."

We are participating in the programme again this year and look forward to sharing our progress again.

Reading Across the Curriculum at Lady Lumley's

We have focused a great deal in lessons on helping students understand and make better use of higher level, academic vocabulary in their speaking and writing across all aspects of the curriculum. This is key to their success at school, and developing a wider vocabulary is obviously a crucial part of accessing reading, in particular academic texts that students read every day across all their lessons. As well as continuing to help students improve their reading skills and strategies so they can have the best possible outcomes at GCSE and A-level, we also want to provide more opportunities for students to engage in wider reading across their school subjects. We will be

focusing this year on encouraging students to engage in reading more around subjects, whether this be in the form of books, magazine publications, podcasts, video links and so on. We hope that this will allow students to deepen their understanding of the subjects and topics they are studying in school as well as continuing to improve their reading skills on an academic level. Ultimately, we hope that wider reading will help our students to develop more academic independence and develop effective research skills which can be applied to work and academic life beyond school.

We are very fortunate to have a new librarian this year – Donna Rueth, who will be working closely with curriculum leaders to improve our library provision for students both in terms of fiction, non-fiction, and texts which link more closely to the different curriculum areas.

Greetings from the Library!

My name is Ms. Donna Rueth and I'm excited to join the staff at Lady Lumley's and to manage the heart of the school, the Library.

I am a teacher librarian and have many years of experience working in the UK and the USA, where I managed a school library for 7 years.

I have already met with the KS3 classes to introduce myself and share my plans to update our collection, and I plan to partner with the English department to support their work throughout the school. The non-fiction section will be weeded of dated materials and the fiction section will be rearranged by genre in order to help students find books that appeal to them. I will be collaborating with teachers across the curriculum to ensure there are books in the library that allow their students to gain a deeper understanding of their subject areas.

Reading for pleasure has many benefits:

- an increase in vocabulary
- stronger skills in spelling and maths,
- increased empathy
- improvement in relationships with others
- reduction of the symptoms of depression
- improvement of general wellbeing

My hope is that the library will offer a safe space for students and that we will see an improvement in academics and social skills as a result of their engagement with literature.
