Maths Challenge News

Before Easter Harry Monkman in year 11 sat the Maclaurin Olympiad, this was a two-hour paper made up of 6 problem solving questions. The results seemed to take a long-time to come through, but a couple of weeks ago we got the amazing news that he had scored a merit. Well done, Harry.



Mathematics Trust

Just after the Easter Holidays almost 60 Year 7 and 8 students sat the hour-long Junior Maths Challenge online. Earlier this week we were able to share the results with them, with a very high proportion of the students being awarded Bronze, Silver, and Gold Certificates.

In Year 7 Tymon Zmudzki was awarded the Gold Certificate in addition to Best in Year. In year 8 Nikita Grayson, Leo Bamfield and Cherry Askoolum Wroe were all awarded a Gold Certificates with Nikita **Grayson** also awarded Best in School with an outstanding score of 117.

The bar was set high to qualify for the next round; **Nikita Grayson's** score not only qualified her for the next round of the competition, but she has been offered an invitation to take party in the Junior Maths Olympiad which is only open to the top 1200 students nationwide. This two-hour paper consists of 16 problem solving questions and I look forward to sharing news of her success with you before the summer holidays.

That wraps up the UKMT Maths Challenges for this academic year, but I hope to see even more students participating next year.

Careers Appointments

This half term, Year 10 have begun their careers appointments with our dedicated careers advisor, Anna Lowe. Following each appointment, students receive a personalised copy of what was discussed and where to look for further guidance. By the end of Year 11, all students will have had at least one appointment with Mrs Lowe.

Careers in Life lessons

Students in Years 7 and 9 have been exploring their skill sets, how their personality traits lead into employability skills as well as looking at what employers expect from them as employees and what they can expect from employers in return.

Careers Fairs

So far this year, Years 8, 11 and 12 have attended various careers fairs: Year 8 attended Scarborough Science and Engineering Week back in October, Year 11 attended Opportunity Knocks here at Lady Lumley's in March and Year 12 attended the National Apprenticeship Show in Harrogate in October.

To supplement these, Life lessons have also looked at employability skills, students have had the opportunity to research potential career paths and the qualifications available to them at different stages. Next month, Years 10 and 12 will be able to meet and engage with a range of employers at our upcoming Careers Fair (June 22nd). We currently have the following confirmed: RAF, Army, the NHS, Smailes Goldie, Wilf Warm Family Trust, York College and Derwent Training, among others. This will be a great chance for students to liaise with local and regional employers and providers to explore the breadth of opportunities out there.
