
- Lady Lumley's curriculum is a progression model and:

## Personal Development through the Character Curriculum



This is the curriculum that focuses on the development of key, learning behaviours and attitudes in and out of the classroom. These are the key qualities and skills that are developed to support preparation for the future.

#### The What-Core Value explained

Students develop a greater understanding of teamwork through effective communication, with a focus on speaking and listening.

#### Leading

Students develop self-regulation that enables them to take responsibility for themselves and be respectful members of the school community. They have a sense of belonging to the school and understand how to be safe.

#### **Progress**

Students develop resilience through problem solving and endeavour to stay positive and solution-focused.

#### **Personal Development to support transition points**



At Lady Lumley's we want to equip our students to be ready for every stage of their learning journey. This starts before they arrive in Year 7 and continues when they leave Year 13. Every year is valuable and brings different challenges and opportunities.

At key transition points students experience new challenges and opportunities, that will help to shape their future. We recognise the importance of these points and the need to provide advice, guidance and support to enable students to make informed choices and be ready to embrace new challenges.

We recognise the importance of a well-structured and supportive transition programme to enable students to make a strong start to their time at LLS. In Year 7, Personal Development is accessed by students in a number of ways, one of which being the 'Lady Lumley's Leadership Award'.

The 'Lady Lumley's Leadership Award' is accessed through a weekly lesson that complements the 'LIFE' lesson. This is a taught programme that will focus on students developing their character and gaining a better understanding of their place in the world. The award provides opportunities to access a range of enrichment opportunities and develop different skills across the year.

The award is structured so that students have the opportunity to aim for 'Bronze', 'Silver' and 'Gold' levels.

The end of year celebration recognises students' engagement with the award and their achievements.

Personal Development in Year 9 We recognise the importance of a well-structured and supportive transition programme to enable students to make a strong start to Key Stage 4. The preparation for this in Year 9 is vital.

The 'Futures' programme is accessed through a fortnightly lesson that complements the 'LIFE' lesson. This will be a taught programme that focuses on students developing their understanding of managing finances and preparing for the world of work. There will also be extensive advice and guidance built in to support students with the KS4 options process and the multiple opportunities for our students to demonstrate being their best beyond Lady Lumley's School.

Personal Development in Year 12 Sixth Form signals the beginning of a unique experience for all students. It brings exciting new challenges and opportunities.

The Personal Development programme in Year 12 is a bespoke package that students access every week.
