Year 11 French / Art visit to Paris: October 15th -18th

This was the second year running for our Y11-13 visit to Paris, with 36 Year 11 students, accompanied by Miss Wilson, Mr McGrath and Miss Ashworth, and fortunately no bed bugs despite some initial concerns!

We had two full days in Paris, on Monday visiting Montmartre, the Latin Quarter and Notre Dame (viewed from outside as it is still closed following the fire a few years ago). We also had a fabulous view of Paris from the top of Montparnasse tower.

Tuesday involved a boat trip down the river, an hour spent frantically waving at every Parisian in sight, some time to crane our necks looking at the Eiffel Tower and then a visit to the Musée d'Orsay which has a fantastic collection of Impressionist and Post-Impressionist art. The Centre Pompidou was

unfortunately closed due to a strike, but Mr McGrath had the team sketching this fabulous, inside-out building from outside. We ended with a brief visit to the Champs Elysées and a quick coach spin around the Arc de Triomphe. Evening activities involved both French and Art activities that we ran at our accommodation. Our students were a credit to us, positive and polite throughout, and showed a lot of common sense and maturity when they were given free time to roam the streets of Paris.

He finished with a time of 16 mins 50 secs - winning the medal as fastest 13 year old (plus a box of Kendal mint cake!) and finishing 11th in under 16s.

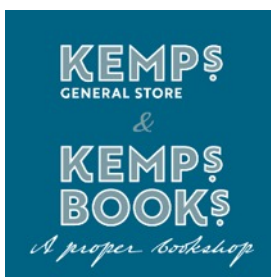
