April News from the Library

Welcome back! I hope you all enjoyed the Easter break and are ready for the summer weather to kick in! I managed to add a few more books to my *Read* list on Goodreads during the holiday and seem to be on a bit of a murder mystery trend, which does not make for comfortable bedtime reading!

In the library we have launched into the summer term with two new projects for our students. Year 8 students will be undertaking an author study – finding out about a selected author and reading their books to see whether they can make connections between the



experiences of the author and the stories they tell. Students will be adding notes to our interactive display to share what they have learned.

Year 7 students have been given Reading Journals in which they will be recording their reading lives, making note of the books they have read and their thoughts about their choices. English department teachers and I will be



responding to the student entries, building up a conversation about our literary lives. It will be interesting to look back and reflect on how reading habits and appetites change over time.

The season for film awards is behind us and now it's time for authors to be celebrated for their work. *The Carnegie Medal for Writing,* established in 1936, is a British literary award that annually recognises one outstanding new English-language book for children or young adults. We have copies of the books on the short list and I'm encouraging students to check them out and see if their favourite wins the award. The council is consulting now on a <u>proposed new home to school travel policy</u> for North Yorkshire to ensure compliance with the new statutory guidance. The consultation stage draft of the proposed new policy constitutes a significant re-write of the current policy to more closely align with the language, style and content of the guidance.

This consultation also includes a review of the discretionary areas of the council's current policy, that is those existing provisions that are above and beyond the statutory requirements of the guidance.
