Theatre Visits

We had two theatre visits just before the holiday. GCSE Drama students in year 10 and 11 went to the Theatre Royal in York to see 'North by North by West', an adaptation of the Alfred Hitchcock film. The play was cleverly staged with singing, dancing and lots of humour. We also took 37 year 8 students to see Blood Brothers at the Grand Opera House; we had studied this text in class and students really enjoyed the characters they had played on the professional stage, one student said, "I thought that Blood Brothers was a very exciting experience filled with drama. It can be rather serious at times and rather comical at others. Amazing acting, loads of singing, it was great and I would definitely go and see it again". Year 10 Geography Trip

Our Year 10 Geography students recently enjoyed a successful fieldwork trip to Hornsea as part of their GCSE studies. The focus of the day was to investigate two key enquiry questions: "Are groynes effective in Hornsea?" and "Do housing inequalities in Hornsea exist?" Students collected a range of quantitative data, including measuring sediment build-up on either side of groynes to assess coastal defence effectiveness. They also conducted bi-polar surveys on housing quality across different areas of the town, exploring evidence of social and economic disparities.

The students approached the tasks with great enthusiasm and maturity, working collaboratively and showing real curiosity about the world around them. They were a credit to the school, demonstrating excellent fieldwork and data collection skills. To round off the day, everyone enjoyed a well-earned ice-cream by the sea—well deserved after a productive day of hands-on learning!







Futures Fair

On Tuesday, Students in Years 9 and 10 attended our Futures Fair which had a focus on post-16 choices. Students were able to interact with a range of post-16 providers: Lady Lumley's Sixth Form, Scarborough Sixth Form, Scarborough TEC, Askham Bryan College, York College, Bishop Burton, CU Scarborough, York St John University, Derwent Training, the NHS, Greencore, Anglo-American and Flamingo Land.

Feedback from employers and providers was incredibly positive and they were particularly impressed by our students' engagement. Students will continue these conversations in their Futures (Year 9) and Life (Year 10) lessons.

Road Safety

As part of our ongoing commitment to student wellbeing, a road safety awareness session was delivered to our sixth form students this week. The session aimed to educate young adults—many of whom are new or soon-to-be drivers—on the importance of making safe decisions on and around roads.

Led by a local road safety officer, the session covered key topics including the dangers of distracted driving, the impact of alcohol and drug use behind the wheel, the importance of seatbelt use, and safe pedestrian behavior. Real-life case studies and short video clips were used to highlight the serious consequences of unsafe road practices.



Who Are Young Carers?

Young carers are students who provide care for a family member due to illness, disability, mental health challenges, or addiction. They take on responsibilities that may impact their education and wellbeing.

Signs to Look For

- · Tiredness or lack of concentration
- · Frequent lateness or absences
- Appearing stressed, withdrawn, or anxious
- Difficulty keeping up with schoolwork





How to support young carers

- Build trust to make them feel safe when sharing their situation.
- Adjust homework deadlines or attendance policies when needed.
- Refer them to school counsellors or external support services.
